

Edizioni Farinelli has published a new Italian Film Study text for ***Cristo si è fermato a Eboli***, its 8th in-depth film study text in a series. This classic film released in 1979 and directed by Francesco Rosi is based on the book by Carlo Levi which tells the story of a year spent in exile during World War II to a small, remote and primitive village in Lucania (Basilicata).

**EF Film Study Program: *Cristo si è fermato a Eboli*** was written by Chiara Mazzucchelli, a Visiting Professor of Italian Studies at the University of Central Florida in Orlando and the Editor-in-Chief of the academic journal *Voices in Italian Americana*. Ms. Mazzucchelli has created a text that can be used either as a student manual to accompany the film, or as a primary text integrated with a grammar book and Carlo Levi's novel in an advanced content-based course.

The 50-page, advanced-intermediate level text contains seven units each covering *Abbiamo capito!*, *Arricchiamo il vocabolario*, *Ripassiamo la grammatica*, *Parliamo and Scriviamo*. Additionally, there are *Spunti culturali* for each unit related to cultural topics covered in the film, such as, *Credenze e superstizioni nel Mezzogiorno d'Italia*, *L'impresa coloniale in Abissinia*, *Il brigantaggio*.

The ***Cristo si è fermato a Eboli*** film study text is \$32.95. The DVD for the film is available separately for \$29.95.

The EF Film Study series is a new systematic approach to learning Italian through focused viewing of classic and contemporary Italian films. This series helps university and high school teachers keep their curriculum fresh and interesting.
