

Edizioni Farinelli has published its 9th text in its EF Film Study series. **EF Film Study Program: Ricordati di me** is an advanced-level text developed for Gabrielle Muccino's 2003 release of this sophisticated film. **Ricordati di me** examines personal and professional interests among a seemingly stable, middle class Roman family. It's a movie about life: passions, dreams, responsibilities and grievances. The film is especially rich for classroom use because it recycles vocabulary throughout, its plot is clear and linear, and the Italian is spoken in a clear, natural way with idioms often used.

The new film study text was written by Giuseppe Tassone, a native Italian, who lectures in Italian at the University of Washington and also at Seattle University where he teaches and coordinates the Italian program. Since 1998, he has served as the director of the Italian language program of the Seattle chapter of the Società Dante Alighieri.

The 60-page, text contains six units each covering 15 to 25-minute segments of the film. Each unit tests comprehension, works on building vocabulary and knowledge of grammar, and also includes classroom discussion topics, and themes for written compositions. *Spunti culturali* are present for each unit as well.

The **Ricordati di me** film study text is \$32.95. The DVD for the film is available separately.

The EF Film Study series is a new systematic approach to learning Italian through focused viewing of classic and contemporary Italian films. This series helps university and high school teachers keep their curriculum fresh and interesting. In addition to this new film study program, Edizioni Farinelli also offers texts and DVDs for *Caterina va in città*, *Ciao Professore!*, *Cinema Paradiso*, *Cristo si e' fermato a Eboli*, *Io non ho paura*, *La meglio gioventù*, *L'ultimo bacio* and *Pane e tulipani*.
